Australian Catholic Education Conference



Jesus also reminds us that simply saying we know Him isn't enough. We are called to live like Him in our words and actions. This Gospel is a powerful reminder for us all that it's the quiet acts of love, honesty, and service that truly matter.

As families, may we continue to guide our children to walk through that "narrow door", not because it is easy, but because it leads to a life of meaning, joy, and deep connection with God.

























ART



Prep students collaborated on an outdoor installation called 'The Flock,' using beach rubbish that is often found in their habitats to print patterns onto a shorebird. These incredible birds migrate each year from as far as Syberia to our shores and symbolise the 2025 jubilee theme 'Pilgrims of Hope.' Grade 3/4 students created collaged shorebirds taking inspiration from the book 'Hope is the Thing' by Erica Wagner. They also worked together to build scarecrows for the school gardens.

This term Grade 1/2 students learned about the Emu in the sky, creating their own mixed media Emu's after reading 'Awesome Emu' by Gregg Dreise.

Senior students are studying First Nation artist Brian Robinson and they are busy developing landscapes that blend pop culture symbols with patterns representing their own culture and interests. Stay tuned for their final artworks...





This term, I had the privilege of taking Italian whilst the lovely Mrs Colavecchio was on leave, travelling throughout Italy. The preps began their Italian journey, learning common Italian phrases and Italian customs. They learnt to count to 10 and played Tombola (Bingo!) to demonstrate their understanding. The Grade 3/4 students learnt Italian phrases and used this to gather information about their peer's favourite book, TV show, food and animal. They deepened their understanding of Italian festivities, with special focus on Ferragosto, which signals the Assumption of Mary. Mrs Colavecchio returns this week. The preps created 'Welcome back' cards in Italian for her return, whilst the 3/4 students have planned a demonstration of their learning.

STEM



PE this term has focused on all things Athletics! Students are practising in the events they will be participating in on the 25th of August. Our middle and senior students will participate in:

PREP STEM

The Preps have wholeheartedly leapt into STEM learning this term. We have been learning about the properties of materials, using picture stories as inspiration. Check out the Magnificent Things we created using a range of different materials.







YEAR 3/4 STEM

Our Year 3/4 students have been learning about solids, liquids and gases. We have created models of how these particles interact with each other.

We experimented with melting chocolates. Did you know that Flakes don't melt!?















This term in Library, we have been diving into the CBCA Shortlisted Books and celebrating the Book Week theme, Book an Adventure. We've been exploring the different categories, discussing what makes each story special, and enjoying the many ways books can transport us on a journey.

In Grades 1 and 2, we read 'Don't Worry Felix' and 'The Wobbly Bike'. Both of these stories connect beautifully to emotional literacy. The students loved discussing how the characters overcame challenges and even made connections to times in their own lives when they've had to be brave or try something new.

In Grades 5 and 6, we explored 'South with the Seabirds'.

Students practised their research skills while learning about four incredible scientists and the fascinating history of Macquarie Island. We also read 'A Leaf Called Greaf', which inspired thoughtful discussions and gave students the chance to respond in ways that connected to their own experiences.

It has been such a joy to see the students so engaged, enjoying these wonderful books, and embracing the adventure that reading brings. This term in Drama, our Year 1 and 2 students have been exploring the exciting world of characters and emotions. Through imaginative play and creative movement, students have been learning how to act out different roles and express a wide range of emotions.

To showcase their learning, each student created a mini poster featuring a character they would love to act out in Drama. The creativity on display was fantastic! Some of the characters included a princess, a truck driver, a teacher, a singer, and even a beach ball! It's been wonderful to see students build confidence, express themselves, and have fun through drama. We can't wait to see what characters come to life next!

This term in Drama, our Year 5 and 6 students have been learning about the art of improvisation, where there are no scripts and performers have to think on their feet. To practise this important drama skill, students have been taking part in a variety of short games that help them respond quickly, work as a team, and think creatively in the moment.

It's been great to see students stepping out of their comfort zones, taking creative risks, and having lots of fun along the way. We're excited to continue building these skills as the term goes on!



















SPECIALISTS REWARDS

It has been wonderful getting to know the Preps and the Grade 3 /4's and having fun in the Music Room with them.

This term we have been focusing on rhythm and beat through body percussion, exploring different unpitched percussion instruments and playing some music games. We also have been listening to some different songs in the "Music Appreciation" section of our lessons and it has been great to hear how each individual responds to a piece of music. After listening to "Walking on Sunshine" one of the prep students said he liked it because it "made his ears happy!" One of the 3 /4 students explained how he liked the song "Yellow" because it reminded him of his parents.

The Grade 3 / 4 students did a fantastic job at playing as an ensemble to the "Waltz of the Flowers' from the Nutcracker using tambourines, triangles and drums. They sounded amazing!

During Book Week, the Preps brought to life the book "We're Going on a Bear Hunt" using all different instruments to make the sounds of the grass, river, mud, forest and snowstorm. They really used their imaginations when exploring the different sounds the percussion instruments made and how they could use them to tell the story.

Keep up the excellent work Prep and Grade 3 /4!

Our students have been working hard in their specialist lessons to make positive choices and earn tokens for their specialist reward jars. Once their jar is full, the class gets the chance to flip a coin. Heads means free time outside, tails means free time inside!

It's wonderful to see so many classes reaching their goals and celebrating their efforts together.

In addition, our specialist teachers are keeping an eye out for individual students who go above and beyond in their specialist lessons. These students will be recognised with Specialist Awards later this term, so keep an eye out for our award winners!
