While Easter is still a couple of weeks away, with holidays beginning this weekend it seemed like the perfect time to talk about Holy Week. Completing Term One, we can take some time to stop and reflect how far we have come. For some of our students, they have completed many firsts, and for others, they have completed some things for the last time at St Judes. This term has provided us all with times of joy, challenge, love and hope! It seems only fitting that we will arrive back to Term 2 with a new Hope and Joy that comes with the Resurrected Christ.

But before we begin celebrating the joy that comes with Easter, we need to acknowledge the Journey to the Cross. Holy Week is such a special time in the Church year. It is when we remember the journey of Jesus—His love, His sacrifice, and His victory over death.

So what are the key events of Holy Week?

**YE Palm Sunday** – We remember when Jesus entered Jerusalem, and people welcomed Him by waving palm branches and shouting, **"Hosanna!"** It was a joyful day filled with hope!

**Holy Thursday** – On this night, Jesus shared the **Last Supper** with His disciples. He gave us the gift of the **Eucharist** and showed us how to serve others with love and kindness. His actions give us hope in the power of love and humility.

**Good Friday** – A solemn day when we remember Jesus' great love for us. He carried the cross and gave His life to save us. Even in the darkest moment, hope remained, because God's love never fails.

**Easter Sunday** – The most joyful day of all! Jesus rose from the dead, bringing us new life and **the greatest hope of all**—that God's love is stronger than anything. His Resurrection reminds us that no matter what challenges we face, **hope will always shine through**.

## Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge 2025

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is **now open** to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by **5 September 2025.** 

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books. All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

The Premiers' Reading Challenge website offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
  - a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

### Independent Reading

English

Students in the Year One and Two classes have been practising their reading during the daily 'Independent reading 'session. This is an important component of a well-balanced English program providing a regular opportunity for students to practise fluent reading.

Similarly to Home Reading, books are at an easy level for each student. Reading easy texts provides students with time to practise the reading strategies that they have been learning in their classroom. A focus of Independent Reading sessions is also to build stamina to read for increasingly longer periods of time, an essential skill for developing readers.

My intention for Level Spotlights is to share how learning occurs in these levels, share some photos of learning in action and to offer advice and guidance for parents so they can support learning at home.


#### Year 1 learners

Like in Prep, our Year 1 teachers utilise the Concrete-Pictorial-Abtract approach to learning. Using CPA, new concepts are introduced through the use of physical objects or practical equipment. These can be physically handled, enabling children to explore different concepts in an engaging manner.




Here, our Ones are exploring place value. Using tens frame

trains, they first 'fill' the train to represent a number.. Once students have had a chance to manipulate physical objects, they can utilise drawings or visual models to begin to master mathematical concepts.


