Uniform Guidelines

I would like to take this opportunity to remind families of our school uniform guidelines and thank you for your ongoing support in ensuring our students wear their uniforms with pride. A reminder that the old uniform still may be worn, the only change is navy blue socks are to be worn with the academic uniform.

I am pleased to share that the long sleeve polo shirts and long pants for girls will be made available as part of our uniform options. We are currently working to ensure the uniform website reflects these updates so families can order these clothing articles.

All new uniform articles have our school logo on them. Please do not buy items from shops other than the uniform shop.

Please refer below for some points that clarify a few questions that I have recently been asked.

Tunic May be worn with navy blue tights or navy blue socks

Summer Dress To be worn with navy blue socks only - tights are not permitted

Academic To be worn with navy blue socks - not tights

Shorts/Skorts

Polo Shirts Short sleeve and long sleeve options available

Pants for Girls Long navy pants will be available soon

Sports Should only be worn on allocated sports days, white socks to be

Uniform worn.

Please note: Navy blue tights are to be worn only with the tunic. They are not to be worn with shorts, skorts, or the summer dress.

It's been a big week in the life of the Church and our school. While we initially knew we were coming back to celebrate the new found hope in the Resurrected Jesus, this week also brought many unexpected emotions with the passing of the Pope.

This Easter, Pope Francis reminds us that *hope is alive!* Just like Jesus rose again and brought light after darkness, we can find hope even when things are difficult.Pope Francis says, "Christ is our hope and he is alive!" He wants us to remember that no matter what we face, God's love is stronger.



The next day the world was shocked to hear of Pope Francis' passing. From widespread media and personal encounters it seems to me that people are truly mourning the loss of our blessed father. Whether you are religious or not, people seemed to be able to connect to Pope Francis as a role model figure. So who was he?

Pope Francis, born Jorge Bergoglio in Argentina, has lived a life full of kindness, service, and hope.

As a young man, he was very sick and almost died — but he recovered and decided to give his life to God, helping others. When he became Pope in 2013, he chose the name "Francis" to remind everyone to care for the poor, the earth, and each other. He teaches that even when life is hard, we should never lose hope — just like at Easter, when Jesus rose again and brought joy to the world.

To kick off this term's continued celebration of our *Year of Hope* at school, we created Stations of the Light in classes to show how Jesus' promise of the resurrection, and the true hope of Easter was fulfilled. It was wonderful to see classes and families walking through this space learning about, praying and reflecting upon the Hope that comes with the Resurrected Christ.

There was so much excitement in the Middle and Senior Schools this week as our students started using their **Spelling Mastery** workbooks.

Following our successful implementation of the Little Learners Love Literacy phonics program in the Junior School, we are implementing a structured spelling program, Spelling Mastery, in Years 3-6. Spelling Mastery is a researched based spelling program that develops students' understanding of the rules and patterns of spelling, as well as memorising irregular words.

At St Jude's, students in Years 3-6 have been grouped within their year level according to their learning

needs in spelling. This may mean that students move to a different classroom for their spelling lessons.

Students will have 4 spelling lessons each week, with each lesson providing opportunities for new learning as well as revision and practise of previously learnt skills.

This year, I want to deepen the connection between the Library and our school community by bringing some of our classroom displays to life digitally—so you can enjoy them from home!





Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge 2025

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is **now open** to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by **5**September 2025.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books. All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

The Premiers' Reading Challenge website offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
 - a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review
