In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells His disciples: "Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit...Happy those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes." (Luke 12:35–40) This powerful message reminds us of the importance of being ready. Not just physically, but spiritually. Jesus invites us to be people of light, always prepared to welcome Him into our lives with open hearts. What a beautiful message to carry and unpack as we continue to journey through this Jubilee Year of Hope.

This weekend also marks a very special occasion in our school and parish life. Some of our Year Four students will receive Eucharist for the first time. Our students have been preparing thoughtfully, learning what it means to receive Jesus in the Eucharist and how this Sacrament is a sign of His love and presence with us always.

Just like the servants mentioned in the Gospel who waited eagerly for their master, our First Communicants are getting ready to welcome Jesus in a new and deeply personal way. They are lighting their own lamps of faith through prayer, reflection and learning. Through this time of growth they are learning to open the door of their hearts to Jesus in a deeper way.

Just like our eagerly awaiting students who are about to receive Jesus through the Eucharist for the first time this weekend, we can all be encouraged to reflect on how we can be

spiritually ready to meet Jesus each day, especially through the gift of the Eucharist. We are all welcome at the Altar to come and receive. Just like one of the songs that will be sung during this celebration on Sunday,

"At the table of grace, the cup's never empty. The plate's always full, and it's never too late. To come and be filled with love never ending. You're always welcome at the table of grace"

Let us keep our First Eucharist candidates and their families in our prayers during this sacred journey. Loving Jesus,
Help us to keep our lamps lit with
faith, love, and joy.
May our hearts be open and ready
to welcome You always,
especially in the gift of the Eucharist.

WELLBEING AT ST JUDE'S

'RUOK' WORKSHOP

Our Year 5/6 students recently took part in an engaging and meaningful R U OK? Day workshop. The session explored important topics such as understanding feelings and emotions, what mental health is, and the various factors that can impact our mental wellbeing. A highlight of the workshop was the creation of individual mental health toolkits-this was a personalised resource that each student developed to help them navigate their emotions and strengthen resilience. We hope to continue working with this foundation in the future.





INFORM AND EMPOWER CYBERSAFETY SESSIONS

Students will continue to participate in the Inform and Empower Cybersafety sessions this term. The focuses for each unit are:

-Prep: Learning this term will focus on navigating the online world more safely. They will discuss how not all places on the internet are safe. They will explore how trusted adults can help us stay safe online.

-Year 1/2: Learning this term will focus on the importance of creating strong usernames and passwords and not sharing personal information online. They will also discuss how not everyone online is who they say they are.

-Year 3/4: Learning this term will focus on developing strategies for navigating uncomfortable situations. They will also explore what it means to be an upstander and discuss help-seeking strategies.

-Year 5/6: Learning this term will focus on navigating uncomfortable situations. They will explore strategies for being an upstander as well as how and where to seek help. They will also discuss the importance of consent in online interactions.

Date: Friday 29th August Time: 8.45am in the school hall



Mathematic

Explicit teaching to development efficient mental strategies

What are mental strategies?

Mental strategies in mathematics are flexible and efficient thinking methods used to solve problems without the need to write or draw your workings. These include estimating, partitioning, and using known facts. They help build number sense, improve confidence and enable students to solve problems with less cognitive load. In short, having a range of mental tools at your disposal makes problem solving a less demanding task!

Our Year 2 team have been working to support their students to build robust mental strategies in the area of addition and subtraction.

For ten minutes each day over the course of a two week period, students are explicitly taught how and when to use an efficient mental strategy.





Currently, our Year 2s are learning about the mental strategy near doubles. The near doubles strategy involves students doubling a number and adjusting by 1. For

instance, 3 and 3 makes 6 so 3 and 4 would make 7. You can see that visually in the model to the left. Students have the opportunity to use tactile materials, draw pictures, manipulate visual models in



order to create these mental models that can be relied upon when solving problems.

Test your Year 2 at home! You might be impressed!
