Over the past few weeks, many special names have been chosen—within our school community, as our children prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation, and around the world with the election of a new Holy Father. In our Catholic tradition, a name is never just a label. It speaks of the person's hopes, values, and the kind of heart they carry. When a pope chooses a name, it offers us a beautiful glimpse into the kind of leader he hopes to be and the path he feels called to walk.

# So, why change a name?

Throughout the Bible, when someone's life was transformed in a deep and meaningful way, God gave them a new name—Abram became Abraham, Saul became Paul. A new name marks a new chapter. And whether it's becoming pope or being Confirmed, it's a moment of great change, calling for a new identity rooted in faith, purpose, and mission.

For our Confirmation candidates, choosing a saint is a precious part of their journey. Saints are more than just historical figures—they are heroes of faith who show us how to live with courage, kindness, and love. By choosing a saint's name, each child is choosing a spiritual friend—someone to guide, inspire, and walk beside them as they grow in their relationship with God. Often, they're drawn to a saint whose life mirrors something in their own, making the experience deeply personal and meaningful. Just as our children choose a saint to walk with them, Popes do the same. Their chosen name reflects the kind of shepherd they hope to be.

# For example:

- **Pope Francis** took his name from St. Francis of Assisi, who lived simply and loved deeply, especially those who were poor or forgotten.
- **Pope Leo XIV**, our newly elected Holy Father, chose his name in honour of the previous Pope Leo XIII, remembered for his strong voice for justice and the dignity of workers. His name points to a desire to guide the Church with wisdom, compassion, and a heart for fairness in today's world.

This week, I invite you to have a conversation at home about saints who inspire you or the name your child has chosen for Confirmation. Take a moment to explore that saint's story together—you may even find a new one who speaks to your own heart. What a lovely way to share faith and learn about someone inspiring together.

# **Building Historical Knowledge**

Throughout Term Two, students across St Jude's are studying History. In the Junior school, our students will be learning about their families, how their lives have changed over time, whilst Years One and Two students will also explore the history of our St Jude's community.

Reading and Writing provide the ideal vehicle to learn about our history. Students in the Junior School will be reading fiction and non fiction texts to build their understanding. There will also be many opportunities to build and express their understanding through a variety of writing tasks.

Some examples are -

- Creating a family tree
- Timelines with drawings and labels
- Generating questions to ask family members about their family history
- Information reports about the past and present, or the History of St Jude's
- A description of your family's story

# Mathematics

Solving problems at home

At St Jude's, we understand that supporting your child in mathematics can sometimes feel challenging. That's why we encourage families to explore a **Solving Together** approach. By utilising some of these strategies, you can take the guesswork out of supporting your child mathematically.

# **Solving Together**

Maths is more than numbers, t's a way of thinking, spotting patterns, and solving problems creatively. It's not about always having the right answer, but about being curious, making mistakes, and learning from them.



### Be Curious, ask questions

You don't need to be a maths expert to help your child. Just as a coach doesn't need to be better than the athlete, you can support your child by exploring problems together, listening to their ideas, and asking thoughtful questions like "Can we predict what will happen next?" or "Do you notice any patterns?". Don't tell them what to think, ask them to prompt thinking.

# Acknowledge Effort

Most importantly, praise effort and perseverance. Let your child know that making mistakes is part of learning—and that you're there, learning with them.





# **Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge 2025**

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is **now open** to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by **5**September 2025.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books. All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

The Premiers' Reading Challenge website offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
  - a modern user-friendly interface
- · rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review
